Tree & Shrub Identification

Woody plant identification takes a long time to master. We will identify a number of common Kansas species, and you can learn **how to** identify trees, by noticing branching structure, leaf shapes, bark, and fruit characteristics. Ranges and habitats in Kansas will be discussed.
